Through the joint efforts of our local Emergency Services, The City of Lebanon, Marion County Fiscal Court, The Lebanon Tourism Commission, The Kentucky Fire Commission and State Fire Rescue Training, we are able to provide a wide variety of training opportunities, some of which we hope will be of interest to you.

This is a FREE training program, with no registration fees. We will also be providing a free cookout on Saturday evening for everyone. The instructors for this year's program bring many years of experience and training to our school. Several new and unique training opportunities are offered this year, many of which will offer hands on training.

Pre-registration is encouraged, but not required. On site registration and check in for classes will be held at Centre Square in Downtown Lebanon. Registration will open at 6:30am on both Saturday and Sunday. All classes are scheduled to run from 8:00am to 5:00pm each day. The Arson Investigation/Crime Scene Management class will begin on Friday evening, Oct. 22 at 6:00pm. This class will be held on the 2nd floor of the David R. Hourigan Government Building. On site registration will be open at 5:00pm at this location.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- This is a **FREE** Fire School. There are no registration fees.
- Free cookout and meal on Saturday Night
- Pre-Registrations must be received by October 15th
- Walk in registration will be accepted, but class selection may be limited.

CANCELLATION

Courses not meeting the required pre-registration count by October 15th 2010 will be cancelled. If your class is cancelled, you will be notified by phone or by e-mail.

FIREFIGHTER ID NUMBERS

All certified firefighters must include your **Firefighter Identification Number** on the registration form, all others must use the last four digits of your Social Security Number. EMS personnel may use your Kentucky Certification Number.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- All applicable NFPA Standards will be strictly followed and enforced.
- Courses requiring NFPA 1403 prerequisite(s) or Firefighter Certification require a **signed approval form from the Fire Chief or Training Officer.**
- Explorers and Jr. Firefighters **must submit permission release form.**
- Explorers and Jr. Firefighters can only register for designated courses.
- **Proof of age required:** You must be at least 18 years of age and a member of a Fire Department recognized by the Kentucky Fire Commission to participate in hands-on training. ID's will be checked before allowing students to participate in skills training or testing, must be state issued picture ID.

COLLEGE CREDIT HOURS

College degree credit hours can be received for approved courses listed in the brochure, other courses are offered for non-degree credit.

CERTIFICATE

Instructors will award certificates/training hours (yellow sheets) at the completion of each course for the actual hours attended. **Marion County Fire School Certificates** will be awarded after completion and attending the **entire course**. No certificate will be awarded for partial completion. You are responsible for entering your training hours into the Kentucky Fire Commission training records system.

2010 CLASS DESCRIPTION

Class 101

Fire Behavior/Control – Live Burn

(D0000 / M0000)

Saturday & Sunday

This is a NFPA 1403 compliant **LIVE-FIRE** course which will utilize an acquired structure (not a burn trailer)

Equipment Needed: Full turnout gear and SCBA with PASS device and spare bottle. All turnout gear must be NFPA compliant; students will not be allowed to participate if the instructors find that the gear is not NFPA compliant or otherwise poses a hazard. SCBA bottles must have a current hydrostatic test date.

Pre-requisites: Completion of NFPA 1403 required components prior to enrolling; “Live Fire Course Competency Validation” form must be submitted with registration form. Any student with facial hair that impedes the seal of the face mask will not be allowed to participate in accordance with NFPA Standards. Live Fire Training Release must be signed the day of the class.

Class 102
Basic Firefighting
Saturday & Sunday

This course will cover some of the toughest and hardest to get subjects to find for certification. This course is unique in that it offers both classroom lecture and hands on skills utilizing an acquired structure

Salvage –	N0000 (2 hours)
Overhaul –	O0000 (2 hours)
Ventilation –	H0000 (2 hours)
Ladders -	J0000 (2 hours)
Forcible Entry –	G0000 (4 hours)
Safety –	B0000 (4 hours)

Equipment Needed: Full structural turnout gear and SCBA with PASS device and spare bottle. All turnout gear must be NFPA compliant: SCBA bottles must have current hydrostatic test date.

Pre-requisites: Must have completed the Basic 20 Hours of training as required by the Kentucky Fire Commission for structural entry. Live Training Release must be signed the day of the class.

Note: The Kentucky Fire Commission, State Fire Rescue Training and The Marion County Fire School shall not be responsible for any damage that may occur to SCBA's or turnout gear during this training class.

Class 103

Firefighter Survival and Rescue (FRS 2052) Saturday & Sunday

(FC0001 / FC0002)

Saturday & Sunday

This course is designed to help firefighters save themselves when trapped or involved in an impending flashover. This course is required for Kentucky Firefighter Certification and upon successful completion of the course, 1.1 hours of degree credit will be awarded for FRS 2052. **“Participant” certificates issued to all completing required skills, “Observer” certificates issued to those that attend lecture only.**

Equipment Needed: Full turnout gear including SCBA. Out of service SCBA may be used. It is recommended that you bring a department SCBA that is for training only as damage can occur to the SCBA’s.

Note: The Kentucky Fire Commission, State Fire Rescue Training, and The Marion County Fire School shall not be responsible for any damage that may occur to SCBA’s or turnout gear during this training class.

Pre-requisites: Competent and proficient in the use of PPE. Live Training Release Form must be signed the day of the class.

Class 104

Explorers / Jr. Firefighter Training

Saturday & Sunday

This course is exclusively for the explorers and Jr. firefighters. It will cover 16 of the needed hours for firefighter certification in Kentucky. This class will consist of classroom lecture and outside demonstrations and skills. This class is limited to those individuals under the age of 18.

Class 105

EMS Continuing Education

Saturday & Sunday

This course will provide 16 hours of Basic refresher training for both **First Responders and EMT-Basics** which are required for the National Registry and KBEMS re-certification.

Medical- P0010 (3 hours)

Preparatory- P0007 (3 hours)

Airway- P0008 (3 hours)

Patient Assessment- P0009 (4 hours)

Trauma- P0011 (3 hours)

Equipment Needed: CPR Mask, gloves, stethoscope, and blood pressure cuff

Note: This class will also cover landing zone procedures and safety for air medical helicopters.

Class 106

Advanced Vehicle Rescue

(Q0001)

Saturday & Sunday

This course includes classroom and practical evolutions. New vehicles, hybrid and multi-air bag cars will be discussed. Students will demonstrate their knowledge of basic hands-on extrication techniques and principals. Students will use both hand and power tools to extricate the patients from simulated vehicle crashes. Large vehicles such as buses will be used in addition to cars for the hands-on training.

Equipment Needed: Full turnout gear or extrication jumpsuit, helmet or hardhat, gloves, fire boots or steel toed shoes, and eye protection. Eye protection must be in the form of safety glasses or goggles. Face shields do not meet the requirements of this class.

Pre-requisite: Students should have a basic knowledge of hand and power tools used in extrication. Live Training Release Form must be signed the day of the class.

Class 107

Arson / Crime Scene Management

(Y0000)

Friday Evening, Saturday & Sunday

This class will teach the fire service personnel how to “TREAT YOUR FIRE SCENE AS A CRIME SCENE”. The classroom presentation will cover many phases of initial scene investigation with emphasis on the firefighter’s responsibility in arson detection. This course will also provide response personnel with knowledge of proper procedures and guidelines for crime scene management and preservation. Students will participate in a staged fire/crime scene investigation and take part in a Mock Court Room Trial.

Equipment Needed: Note pad, pencils or pens, safety glasses, gloves, helmet or hard hat, and sturdy shoes (no tennis shoes or slick sole shoes)

Pre-requisite: Students enrolled in this class must have permission form signed by the chief of the department. Live Training Release Form must be signed the day of the class.

Class 108

Chaplain Training

(JJ0000)

Saturday & Sunday

This course is designed to teach the layperson or fire department chaplain the necessary skills to help fire departments and other emergency service organizations in time of spiritual and/or emotional trauma or crisis. Special emphasis will be placed on Crisis Intervention and Critical Incident Stress Debriefing.

Equipment Needed: Note pad and pencil.

Class 109

Driver Training

(CC0001)

Saturday & Sunday

This course will include class room presentation, and field cone course. Students will also have the opportunity to use the Kentucky Fire Commission Driving Training Simulator. Students are encouraged to bring a department apparatus or vehicle to drive on the cone course, a Pumper or Engine will be provided.

Pre-requisite: Students must be at least 18 years of age and have a current valid Drivers license.

Instructor(s): State Fire Rescue Training

Class 110

Basic Rope Rescue

(I0000)

Saturday & Sunday

This is a hands-on course that prepares students for real-world technical rope rescues. This course covers the technical aspect of rope equipment, as well as:

- Practical applications of rappelling/lowering techniques
- Anchor systems
- Safety systems
- Communications

Students will learn techniques for life-saving operations in the vertical environment, while maintaining an adequate level of safety for the rescuer and the patient. Techniques will include rappels, lock-offs, belays, and working with litters. Students should come prepared to work.

Equipment Needed: Helmet with a suspension system and chin strap (Fire helmets OK), lace-up boots with ankle support, clean leather gloves, eye protection and clothing suited for the weather.

Pre-requisite: students enrolled in this class must sign the Live Training Release Form the day of the class.

Instructor(s): State Fire Rescue Training

Class 111

First-Aid / CPR-AED

(P0001)

Saturday & Sunday

Students will learn how to recognize and respond to breathing and cardiac emergencies in the CPR portion of the course. The AED portion teaches students when and how to use an AED (automated external defibrillator). First Aid teaches students to learn how to recognize and respond to emergencies caused by injury or sudden illness. In conjunction with First Aid, Universal Precautions (also known as Blood-Borne Pathogens training) are infection control procedures that involve the use of protective barriers. These barriers include gloves, gowns, aprons, masks and protective eyewear, which can reduce the risk of exposure. These measures also include personal hygiene practices like hand washing and the disposal of contaminated materials.

Instructor(s): TBA

Notes: This course is not only for the Emergency Services Responders, but is also open to the Industrial and Manufacturing employees, and the General Public.

This course repeats on Saturday and Sunday

Class 112

Emergency and Disaster Planning / Shelter Operations

(X0000)

Saturday & Sunday

This course is divided into two sections: The first day, you will cover Fire Department planning and response to weather related emergencies. Fire Departments today do much more than just respond to fires. The fire service has an increasing role as an “all-hazard” response agency. Each year, Kentucky experiences a wide variety of weather phenomenon which ultimately leads to responses from the local fire department and other public service agencies. The second day will cover policies and procedures for setting up, running and closing a shelter during a disaster. The course includes lecture and group exercises
